A letter from the Artistic Director

Dear Friends of Ballet Theatre of Maryland,

Welcome to our 47th season at Maryland Hall for the Creative Arts. It is with immense pride, gratitude, and excitement that I share this year's program with you: *Giselle*, our new production of *The Nutcracker* featuring Maryland history, *Momentum: A Mixed Bill*, and *La Esmeralda*. Each of these works has been chosen with the strengths of our company and the experience for you, our audience, in mind.

This season is especially meaningful for me. *Giselle* holds a special place in our history — it was the first mainstage production we staged back in Maryland Hall after the pandemic. To bring it back now feels like coming home, again renewing a bond with this theater, this community, and all of you.

In December, we present an all-new *Nutcracker*, reimagined through the lens of our local history in and around Annapolis. Drawing from local landmarks, historical themes, and our city's storied past — from the Chesapeake harbor to the William Paca House to 19th-century Main Street — I hope this version will resonate not only as a holiday tradition, but as a celebration of place, memory, and shared identity.

In February, *Momentum* invites us into a space of discovery. This mixed bill is where classic meets contemporary, where emerging voices harmonize with familiar ones, and where we honor the spirit of innovation that keeps our art form alive and vital.

Then, in April, we close the season with *La Esmeralda*, which makes its professional premiere in Maryland. Adapted from Victor Hugo's *The Hunchback of Notre Dame*, this ballet is full of spirit, heart, and daring — a story of courage, love, and transformation.

As you settle into your seats throughout our season, I hope you will lean into the contrasts: the haunting and the jubilant, the classical and the new, the local and the universal. Ballet is a dance of storytelling through motion and emotion, and each of these works gives us a different lens to see ourselves, our community, and each other.

I am grateful to our dancers, creative staff, sponsors, trustees, and volunteers — for your artistry, commitment, and enthusiasm. Even more, thank you to you, our audience, for believing in this company and sharing this journey. We look forward to dancing for you and with you this season.

GISFLLE

ACT ONE A MEDIEVAL RHINELAND VILLAGE

As villagers prepare to celebrate the grape harvest, Giselle has fallen in love with who she believes is another villager named Loys. Unbeknownst to her, he is actually Albrecht, Duke of Silesia. With the help of his squire, Wilfred, Albrecht hides his true identity. He and Giselle love to flirt and dance together, but a village boy named Hilarion is jealous of Albrecht. Giselle's mother, Berthe, reminds her she must be careful of her weak heart.

Wilfred warns Albrecht that members of the nobility are approaching the village, and Albrecht hurries away without his sword. The Duke of Courland and his daughter Bathilde arrive to rest from the rigors of the hunt. Giselle and Berthe host them, and Bathilde is so charmed by Giselle that she offers her the gift of a necklace. The two nobles disappear into Giselle's cottage as the villagers celebrate with a grape stomping dance. Hilarion interrupts Giselle to show Albrecht's sword. To prove Albrecht is lying, Hilarion blows the Duke's hunting horn.

Drawn by the familiar sound, Bathilde and the Duke step outside. Giselle realizes not only that Albrecht is a nobleman, but that he is betrothed to Bathilde! Overwrought by emotion, Giselle goes mad. It proves too much for her heart to bear. When Giselle collapses, Berthe pushes Albrecht aside. Surrounded by villagers, Giselle passes away.

ACT TWO A FOREST CLEARING

Hilarion mourns at Giselle's grave, but is frightened away by Myrtha, Queen of the Wilis. She and her sisterhood of vengeful spirits were once young women betrayed by their lovers. They roam the forest at night and force any young men they encounter to dance to their deaths. Myrtha and her wilis awaken Giselle from her grave before retreating into the forest. Albrecht arrives to lay flowers on Giselle's grave and encounters Giselle's spirit. He begs for forgiveness.

Elsewhere, Myrtha and the wilis prey upon Hilarion by dancing him to exhaustion and drowning him in a nearby lake. They turn to Albrecht, whose pleas for mercy are met by Myrtha's cold refusal. When Albrecht grows weary, Giselle dances in his stead. The wilis prepare Albrecht for his final punishment, but it is too late: Giselle has delayed for so long that church bells now signal the break of dawn. The wilis return to their graves, leaving Giselle and Albrecht behind. By refusing the wilis' bitterness, Giselle has freed her spirit from their curse. Bidding Albrecht farewell, Giselle returns to her grave for an eternity of rest.
